A. Introduction:

It's a great pleasure to present before you the 23rd Annual Report of Manav Vikas Seva Sangh (MVSS) and I hope that you will find the report informative and something that will motivate you in your endeavour. We are always grateful to donor agencies, government and non-government for adequate funds available to us not only during the reporting period, but, all these years. This is also an occasion to acknowledge the contribution of our Trustees and Advisors who have been always helpful in our efforts in Rural Development. Also, the real credit for our achievements during the reporting year should go to our village partners and our dedicated staff members. Finally on behalf of the board of trustees I would like to thank all my donors, supporters and villagers for their continued support. I hope that you will enjoy reading this report.

B.1 Vision mission and goal:

Vision: We visualize communities where all enjoy equal rights, opportunities and the members respect each other and live in harmony with the nature and the Divine.

Mission: Empowering the people to have access to their rights and opportunities as well as bringing about systematic changes in view of good governance and social cohesion.

B.2 Objectives

- Providing assistance to the poor to alleviate their immediate needs;
- Supporting self-help programs which involve people and communities in their own development;
- Helping those it serves to restore and preserve their dignity and to realise their potential and sustain them;
- Collaborating with other religious and non-sectarian persons and groups of goodwill in programs and projects which contribute to a more equitable society;
- Responding to victims of natural and man-made disasters;
- Promote integrated and rights-based approach to development;
- Helping to educate the people to fulfil their moral responsibilities in alleviating human suffering, removing its causes and promoting social justice;
- Promoting gender equity and child protection & rights.



B.3 Geographical area

We work in 5 districts of M.P. region Sagar, Raisen, Vidhisha, Guna and Ashoknagar of M.P. region. At present we cover 14 Blocks of 4 districts with over 60 Villages in each district.

C. Activity Description

C.1 Harit Prayas:

This project works for Empowering the common people to have access to their rights and opportunities as well as brining about systemic changes in view of good governance and social cohesion in 24 Villages of Rehli Block in Sagar District. The main GOAL is Economic and political empowerment of the Marginalized Community (SC and ST) so that they can lead a dignified life. it is funded by Caritas Spain. The main achievements were that 1257

families having equal to or less than 5 acres of land, improve their income by 30%. 5 Mahila Mandlas start engaging in IGP, 145 Women Entrepreneurs are linked with Financial Institutions, 21 Land less families acquires the land patta through FRA and start cultivating in more forest land, 40 Panchayat Gramsabha approves and recommends Patta, 40 people Local Van Adhikar Samiti approves and recommends patta, 1359 including 1,000(landless) of the eligible families obtain full benefit, 1563 People have their cards in their custody.



C.2 People Led Development Program (PLDP)

This year a new phase of Miserrior project started in September 2012 we conducted

Selection of 6 staffs and their capacity building on project objectives and yearly planning. We visited individual to individual houses in 20 villages for better knowledge of living condition. This year we formed 13 Mandalas with regard to phasing out of old SHGs from old villages. Base line survey was conducted in 20 new villages. We also



conducted 3 Village level orientations between FRA deprived and FRA claimed people. We also facilitated the lobbying and advocacy for 78 FRA deprived people to demand their rights to land and forests. We have applied for 231 Land Pattas from 20 villages in Gram Sabha. We had organized 12 Orientation and awareness programmes in the villages on CBO management. We also Facilitated 1 Exchange visit and people to people learning-sharing. So far we have, identified Local groups and formation of 13 MMs, 20 FCs, 2 Bal Sabhas, 2 Youth clubs. Mahila Diwas Celebration in 3 Blocks by the village women.



C.3 Child Line India Foundation (CIF)

This year we conducted Nukkad Natak, Awareness songs, Case discussions, Distribution of pamphlets, Wall paintings, Group meeting, Volunteer meeting, Video clip showing, Announcement through auto, Media News paper, Pasting the flex, Hoardings, Flex, Competitions, Slum education, Action songs, Phone testing, Demo activities. On childre's day we conducted a Rally on "CHILD LINE SE DOSTI". We had dealt with



14 child abuse cases, 21 shelter home cases, 60 medical cases, 25 educational support, 8 child marriage cases and 1 child labour case. There was 1 CAB meeting conducted in the presence of Deputy Collector, Sagar.



C.4 Health Project

5 health workers were selected from 5 villages and 7 days and trainings were organized for their capacity building on the basis of project objectives. 62 awareness programs on various health issues were conducted in the operational areas. We had also facilitated regular ANC (Anti-Natal care) and PNC (Post Natal Care) checkups. 38 Shramadhans were conducted. 103 mothers were taken to the



hospital for safe delivery. 22 women had undergone the permanent method of family planning. 19 malnutrition children were taken care by arranging hospital facilities. 168 women were identified as new pregnant mothers and referred them to nearest PHC (Primary Health Center). 1445 people were

identified with illness and provided treatment by referring them to the nearest hospital. 13 people were identified with TB and referred them to the hospital and provided medicine. 160 Malaria test were done and referred to the patient who are positive. 940 persons were provided first aid with the medical kits by CHW (Community Health Worker). Efforts were taken to submit application to provide regular meals in the Aganwady of Bachhaloan village. Monitored the immunization programs run in villages

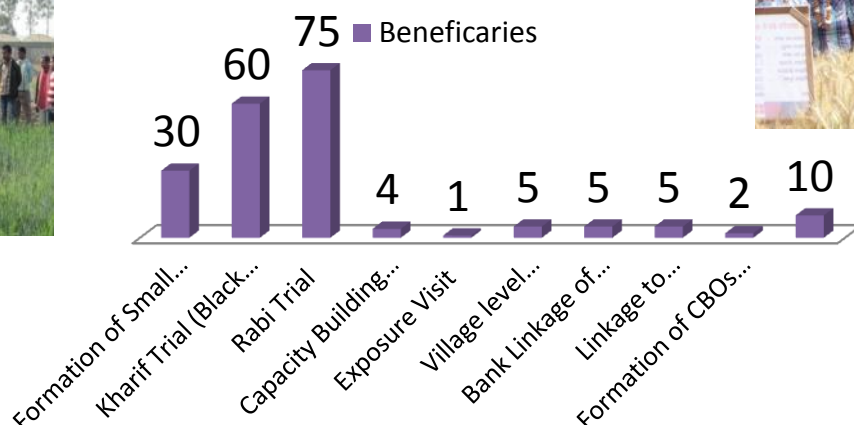


C.5 NABARD

1. **SHPI:** This year we formed 88 SHGs in villages. 56 SHGs were linked with Bank and 72 SHGs were given trainings on Documentation, reporting, financial literacy and Income generation activity. 88 SHGs have a saving of Rs 6,16,000.00 and Rs 5,80,000.00 as inter loaning. With the inter-loaning amount 139 individuals have cleared their remaining amount from Money-lenders and have started IGP by themselves. 4 SHGs were given credit linkage with Banks.
2. **Farmer's Club:** this year we were able to open accounts of the 46 Farmer's club in Axis Bank, Sagar. 30 FC were inaugurated with the help of DDM, Sagar and Bank Managers of State Bank, MBGB and Central Bank. Another 117 FC have been sanctioned in Sagar and Ashokanagar districts for the year 2012-2013.
3. **Group leaders training:** this year we were able to conduct 1 Group Leaders training with the help of NABARD. NABARD registers and booklets were distributed to enhance reporting and accounting of the targeted SHGs.
4. **Jail program (REDP):** this program was inaugurated by CGM, Nabard, DDM, Nabard, Central Jail Superintendent, Sagar, Vicar in General of Sagar Diocese and the Director of MVSS. An 8 weeks program ended with giving a ray of hope to 30 prisoners of Central jail who were going to leave Jail after 6 months. It was a glad moment for many as these prisoners were successfully trained in "Motor winding" and "House wiring" courses through this program.
5. **NFS (Non Farm Sector):** A new project for setting up Agro- based industrial unit was sanctioned by NABARD, Bhopal on a complete grant basis in Central jail Sagar. This programme is intended for improving income generation source of 30 Women Prisoners by producing "Papad, Bari and Muraba". It is a 7 year project promising an amount of Rs 50 per day for a women prisoner involved in it. So far we have completed the inauguration of the programme

D.1 Other Projects

1. IGP (Income Generation Program)

This programme runs with a main intention of providing small loans of amount Rs 5,000 to Rs15,000 for SHG members to do individual IGPs. This year we supported 51 individuals in various fields like seeds for agriculture, Cow rearing, Petty Shops etc

2. CARITAS Micro Project

This project was supported by CARITAS India for providing furniture for 20 orphaned children at St. Francis Shampura Orphanage, Sagar. Accordingly 10 Double Decker beds with mattresses and bed sheets, 10 benches and desks for studies, 10 shelves for safely keeping personal belongings were provided.

3. LIC Madhur Mangal Policy:

This programme is supported by Central Govt. with the motive of including common people of the rural areas by investing petty amount of Rs 150/ month i.e. Rs 5/day. With this amount an individual is able to cover his life insurance for 20 years and also have the saving with interest. 108 individuals were joined to LIC.

4. Birla Sun life insurance policy

Altogether there are 900 individuals covered under this scheme and have policies. 100 Policies were Matured and 2 Death Claims were recovered.

5. TB- Axshya Project

This project is supported by CBCI. It is one of the initiatives of CBC for providing awareness and running health campaign among the rural community. It also works for sputum collection .



6. Slum Education

This year we conducted slum education programme at free of cost for 50 children of 5 slum areas in Sagar District. We distributed free books, charts, and pencils for them. We like to extend the program for 10 slum childrens later this year.
