Thomas Philip; the main objective of this program is to provide elementary education to illiterate women and enhancing their position in family and society. This programme at its initial stage is being operated in selected 5-7 villages by the Coordinators and respective animators at large. Women are taking part in huge number to read and write.

Approx 300 residents of the slum area receive food once in every month. MVSS is trying hard on its sponsorship with the help of the local contribution of generous hearts.

FARMERS’ LEARNING- TURN INTO PRINT MEDIA

Farmers under SAF-BIN project learnt how to produce organic products at low cost and turned their learning’s in to posters which was launched during District Farmer’s Forum Meeting by DDM-NABARD, Chairman MBGB, Soil Specialist KVK Sagar and Director and Assistant Director of MVSS and other dignitaries. SAF-BIN is a project for building small farmers’ future with an objective of development of adaptive agriculture in rain fed area in which farmers are guided to practice adaptive farming. It is a research based project in which farmers practice various methods of production of organic products such as Matka Khad, Macchali Khad, NPK Solution, Seed treatment, Bio-pesticides etc. In these four years farmers learned methods of preparing organic products (Agriculture inputs), it’s usages and various prevention and precaution methods at low cost. At the end they prepared posters on these learning with the help of different expertise related to the project.

HEALTH AND SANITATION CAMP CREATE AWARENESS IN THE RURAL COMMUNITY



Village to village awareness camp was conducted on prevention of T.B. under CBCI CARD Axshaya project. The proportion of T.B patient is quite high in the area. In the 15 villages of Sagar and Guna districts, 27 sputum tests were undertaken; out of which 6 patients (i.e.23%) were found positive and are provided with DOTS treatment from District T.B Center. Regular follow-up of the T.B patients are done by staff of MVSS.

MVSS in two villages of Shahgarh block took initiative to generate awareness on sanitation through conducting rallies along with 135 school children. Similarly another such mass media act on HIV/AIDS awareness was conducted in the villages through folk media.

MANAGEMENT STUDENTS EXPERIENCE RURAL LIFE

PGDM students of XIDAS college of Management, Jabalpur visited MVSS for five days of rural exposure (fully residential). During this exposure student of different states from different management streams visited five villages where MVSS's development initiatives are being carried out. Students applied their academic learning to bring out the deep insights of rural living standard, problems and issues confronted by rural community and level of education, status of infrastructure, livelihood activity of rural society etc. In this entire exposure MVSS played the role of facilitator throughout their stay.



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
