TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE FARMERS EXPOSED TO NEW AGRICULTURE TECHNOLOGY UNDER CAT EXPOSURE

The primary producers of food grains face big challenges on to their own survival due to some obvious reason such as high input cost, climate change, unfair return on produce, lack of resources and knowledge of modern agriculture practices. The situation is more critical when it comes to small and marginal farmers and to fill the gap farmers has to be equipped with new technology, new knowledge and methods. MVSS at its part has always been active for technology transfer towards small and marginal farmers. We have taken 40 farmers from Rehli and Shahgarh block to Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi

Vishva Vidhyalaya, Jabalpur for three days of extension training with the support of NABARD. Majority of participating farmers were of Schedule Cast and Schedule Tribes and having small agriculture land.

Under this farmers were instructed and visited to different modern agriculture methods such as methods of making high return on their small land through effective management of resources. Agriculture scientists of JNKVV discussed Soil science, soil testing, soil health card and use of fertilizers, cultures and other inputs as per soil requirement. Farmers were also trained on micro irrigation system such as drip irrigation, raised-bed irrigation, poly-raised-bed irrigation system, and poly house and were told that how this technology is cost effective for small farmers. Farmers were also introduced to new varieties of seed, fungicide, pesticide, and weedicide along with their usage according to time and crop. Knowing about Custom Hiring Center scheme was most valuable to the farmers. Farmers are happy to have the training and are ready to follow learning into their field.



Gulshan Ahirwar himself: Success Story



A 20 year young boy among four sisters and two brothers from an economically weaker family where his father takes petty shop and mother agriculture labor and Bidi making as a livelihood activity. All his brothers and sisters study in government school. Gulshan passed high school from government school and then he left his schooling in search of work to assists family economically. An unskilled, unprovoked mind and situation let him suffering. Through our mobilization under vocational training he came to know its features and joined three months of Electrical training. He learned throughout, practiced his learning in our electrical lab, we build his capacity and taught him personality development for better placement.

Faced first interview with Luminas Power Technology, Himachal Pradesh through his ability and talent Gulshan won his first job but hardly been able to work for eight days because of inadaptability with Himalayan environment. A boy who left his hometown first time only for a job

which could have been unsaid life success ahead and livelihood support to his family too indeed, came back to home. Denying to do job once again far from home he was counseled by our skilled training professional he once again faced another interview and got selected in Minda Furukawa Electric Pvt. Ltd. Rewadi, Haryana as a Machine Operator with an annual income of 1.2 lacks with transportation, meal and other facilities. Presently he is there for four months and living with joy. Today he sends Rs. 4-5 thousands per month back to his family and is recognized as hero among his local community. Manav Vikas at its part is proud of Gulshan and hold the honor of providing vocational training to unemployed youths with no higher education, skill and without resources of rural area.

NEW CENTERS

Our commitment to support rural poor, marginalized, deprived and weaker section continues. We have established three new social work centers in order to tap new beneficiaries even though we lack fund and without any external support MVSS dare to inaugurate centers at Khurai, Garakota and Gulabganj.

HEALTH CAMP FOR ASTHMA PATIENTS

A Health Camp for Asthmatic patients in Gidwani village was conducted with the help of district health department. In this camp we have provided treatment to old aged people facing problem of breathing. Patients were fully diagnosed by the specialists and counseled for regular treatment along with their caretaker.

Anticipating that mass population travelling to Ujjain Sinhashth 2016 coming across the country via Bina junction through rail route hence chances of child lost, human trafficking and kidnapping etc could take place in bulk being reason we have launched KHOYA PAYA programme as security purpose and preventive and precaution measures so that such cases do not occur and if immediate action could be taken. During this period child line Sagar appointed its staff at Bina Junction with close coordination with GRP, Bina and other related departments. This action was appreciated, recognized by local administration and government officials.

The chronic water scarcity backed by climate change in Indian states spoil sleep of villagers, especially women travel half a day having pail over the head in search of drinking water in this roasting sunlight. This has been a regular practice for last three months in villages of Sagar districts. Their regular water sources had been dried out.

Our intention of taking such activities is the holistic development of children and to explore their unrecognized perfection. In this camp students were fueled with moral education, physical education and sportsmanship. During this children had organized and participated in various cultural activities. Villagers and children's were happy enough by participating first time in such programmes and they themselves promise to organize next summer camp with some new components which may help them.



YOUTH GETS PLACEMENT AFTER VOCATIONAL TRAINING



Manav Vikas Seva Sangh is providing vocational training to school dropout, unskilled, unemployed and needy young folk in collaboration with Don Bosco Academy. We have successfully provided training to our first batch we have trained 320 students through our three training centers in Sagar, Jaisinagar and Vidisha among which we have been able to provide placement to 45 students at various position throughout India with an average package of 1.08 PA. We provide training in various streams such as Electrical, Computer, Industrial Sewing Machine Operator, Beautician, Motor winding, Automobile repairing and Hospitality Management. Our main aim is to generate employment for the young.

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
